For worshippers who struggle with their hearing, we have a hearing loop installed in the floor of the sanctuary. To receive the loop signal manually, activate your T-coil or the telephone setting on your hearing aid or cochlear implant. If you are unsure, please consult your audiologist. If you don't wear hearing aids, but need assistance, please ask an usher for a loop receiver.

Please know, if you need to step out of the sanctuary for any reason, you can watch the service on *livestream* in the hospitality suite. Also if you can't make it to church, you can watch the 11:00 a.m. service *live* on our website - or later during the week at your convenience.

### • Children Are Welcome

We believe that worship is the response of the whole people of God, and that includes children! Families may sit together throughout the worship service. If you are interested, child care for newborns up to five years old is provided by a trained, caring staff each week in the nursery behind the sanctuary.

Parents, ask an usher for a **worship bag** for your children so they can engage in creative activities while remaining in worship.

### • SURE Update

Last week, Sarasota County commission voted to reduce mobility fees for smaller, more affordable units. SURE has encouraged this shift for two years, and was present to voice their support and other actions to create affordable housing. Elder Barbara

Chase spoke before the commissioners, asking them to "serve on behalf of the 15,000 families on the verge of homelessness." This zoning change is a step in the right direction, but it is only one step of others needed.

While we follow-up with our officials to ensure their promises are met, we are also working to increase support through our Investment Drive. Over the course of the next two months we will meet with 40 business owners in Sarasota to invite them to invest in a better Sarasota.
