

Announcing Our Fall Worship Schedule

On **Sunday, August 15**, we will resume our pre-pandemic worship schedule of a 9:00 a.m. NewSong service in the Fellowship Hall, and an 11:00 a.m. traditional service in the sanctuary. The educational hour will take place at 10:00 a.m., as it has done in the past. The session's decision to adopt this plan came after careful consideration of various viewpoints and options. The elders also weighed heavily the input received through the recent congregational survey about matters of worship style and schedule. I appreciate the opportunity to communicate with you about our future together, and also to reflect on our experiences of worship for the past fifteen months.

When the COVID-19 crisis forced us to close public gatherings, we had to rethink worship. Like all churches, we were called to respond in a mysterious new situation with the limited information available to us. We had new challenges on all fronts, and I'm grateful for the dedication of our tech team, who combined a steep learning curve with a deep desire to serve our spiritual family. We all had to learn new skills and quickly resource ourselves as producers of pre-recorded services. There were times when we felt overwhelmed by the many questions about how to proceed, how best to minister, how to function without any of the normal patterns of the past.

One of the biggest uncertainties was the question of worship style. It was clear that we couldn't produce two different style services each week with the financial and human resources we had. So we made a BIG ask of you. We asked you to enter with us into the weekly adventure of an eclectic style service. I know this was not easy for those who have strong feelings about musical style. And I'm grateful that so many in our community offered patience, encouragement, and understanding in a difficult season.

Fast forward to today, as vaccines have become widely available and our in-person congregation is slowly rebuilding. Our staff, Worship and Music Committee, and session pondered the possibility of offering just one blended-style service indefinitely. However, the results of our recent survey indicate that, while there is some support for a blended service, the desire to return to a two-style worship model is strong. This was helpful information. All voices and views were, and are, important in this ongoing discussion of worship style, and we are grateful for the care and candor of all those who participated in the survey.

As we move back into a contemporary/traditional service schedule, there are important questions for us to consider:

- What have we learned from worshiping together in one eclectic-style service?
- How do we grow our oneness in the Spirit, amid our differences?
- Granting that we will return to two different styles of worship each week, are there seasons and occasions when it will be good for us to all come back together?

There are no quick and obvious answers. But our strength and love are nurtured in our responses to open-ended questions like these. May God's blessing rest upon this beautiful spiritual family as we treasure both our deep unity and our glorious diversity in the spirit of Christ!

Meeting with State Attorney Brodsky

In our Fellowship Hall on June 14, Bishop Kenneth Ellis of Koinonia Life Impact Church opened the meeting with prayer. For this negotiating meeting, each SURE congregation was invited to have one clergy member and one lay person attend. Bishop Ellis reminded all of us that God's work is not easy.

Various viewpoints were presented in this one and a half hour meeting. In order to discuss issues which were raised, Dorothy Murphy called for a caucus. After the caucus, Rev. Wayne Farrell of St. Boniface Church reviewed what was discussed.

The following are points for further discussion between State Attorney Brodsky and SURE:

- 1. Fees for Adult Civil Citation will be between \$100 to \$200. The largest disagreement SURE has is with these fees. We continue to be concerned about families who make less than \$40,000 a year who struggle to pay that kind of fee. We would consider a sliding scale where those making \$40,000 or less would pay \$50 and those who make above \$40,000 could pay significantly more and perhaps make up the difference in revenue.
- 2. SURE can appeal to community agencies for financial support of the program.
- 3. Driving on a suspended license could be merged into a Sarasota Traffic Diversion program.
- 4. The State Attorney has agreed to give SURE monthly updates with copies of any draft documents.
- 5. The State Attorney believes that the Adult Civil Citation program can realistically be up and running by November 8.
- 6. The State Attorney agrees it is feasible to run a pilot Adult Civil Citation program with only Sarasota County before introducing the program to the other two counties in his jurisdiction.

Discussing Opiods with Your Doctor

Opioid pain relievers are the most fatally misused legal drug sitting in the medicine cabinet. Some opioids come from the poppy plant, while others are synthetic derivatives. Common prescription opioids include Codeine, Vicodin, Demerol, Methadone, Morphine and Oxycodone.

Research indicates people who take opioid painkillers can quickly develop a dependence on this class of drug, yet 70% of doctors prescribe opioids longer than the CDC recommends, according to a National Council survey.


64% of opioid users have at least one addiction risk factor, such as alcoholism or depression. 33% of painkiller users are not even aware they are taking opioids.

If you are prescribed an opioid, use this reference sheet to start a conversation with your doctor to take control of your healthcare.

12 Questions

TO ASK YOUR DOCTOR BEFORE TAKING OPIOIDS

There are appropriate medical uses for prescription opioids—but, these medications also pose serious risks. To keep yourself and your family safe, it's important to have a detailed conversation with the doctor before going home with a painkiller prescription. Use these questions as a guide.
