With new COVID-19 cases surging in our area, and evidence that the Delta variant is more easily transmitted than previous strains (including fully-vaccinated, asymptomatic persons), the session has decided unanimously to require masks of all persons (over the age of two) who are on our campus, including outdoor gatherings. An exception was granted for fully-vaccinated adult groups who are working outside (with no children present). Such groups may decide together whether or not they intend to mask. This policy will go into effect on August 2.

We do this out of concern:


- for our children, who are not able to receive vaccinations:
- for the most vulnerable members of our community, who may be at risk, even if vaccinated;
- for the larger community, in an attempt to help to slow the spread of the virus.

It can be discouraging to take what may feel like a step backwards, but your session is committed to remaining flexible enough that we can respond to circumstances as they change. The staff and committees of the church will be taking a fresh look at activities planned for the coming weeks. It's likely that some of those plans will need to change, but we will work hard to keep you updated.

• SunCoast Blood Center Concierge Service

Did you know that the SunCoast Blood Center has a concierge service? I did not know that until recently.

A friend told me she was not comfortable going into a blood mobile or to the center these days, but knew they were desperate for blood. As her family has several medically fragile members, I knew they were also taking health precautions seriously.

She arranged for the concierge van to visit her house and made appointments for three of us at the one stop. It was quick and easy. We had each completed the quick pass on-line and had our barcodes ready. The first person

went into the van to donate with only the tech present. After she finished, the next person received a text when the tech was ready and she donated. Then the third person received a text and donated.

If you are uncomfortable going to the center or to a blood mobile, this may work for you. Recruit some friends and family members so one trip out secures multiple donations. Schedule your concierge donor appointment by calling (844) 972-6819. Be flexible with your appointment time as they could be running a little early or a little late.

• Financial Update Through the Second Quarter

As previously communicated, our pledges for 2021 were down approximately 25% from our 2020 campaign. However, with your faithful giving last year, coupled with conservative spending and the full forgiveness of our PPP loan, our 2021 budget was developed with expectations that we would be able to return to in-person worship services and fully support our various missions and ministries for the year at near pre-pandemic levels.

June Year-to-date Results

Through the first six months of 2021, our pledge receipts are running just slightly behind our budget.

However, as illustrated in the graph, most of our 2021 pledge collections thus far took place in January, thanks to strong pre-payments received in late 2020 and in January, 2021. The trend for the remaining five months of this year has been less enthusiastic. While we are accustomed to seeing a slowdown in collections during our summer months, the last two months have fallen well short of our budget estimates.

On a positive note, we continue to keep a close eye on our expenses and we are currently \$112,000 under our budget in spending for the first half of the year leaving us in a very stable financial position despite all of the challenges we have faced over the last 15 months.



Moving Forward

Our staff and volunteers have worked very hard to deliver an inviting worship experience to our church family and our campus is ready to accommodate additional community outreach opportunities. As we begin to transition back to in-person worship, open the preschool for a new year, and host community activities, we will see more re-engagement with one another and hopefully, a return to normalcy for our church family.

The session will continue to keep a close eye on giving and we will match that to our spending levels to ensure that we maintain our solid financial footing through these trying times. With your help, we will continue to support the vital missions and ministries of our church.

Continuing with the Goal in View

The Affordable Housing research team has been placed on hiatus awaiting a full review of this justice issue. Our SURE network members are not deterred from their ongoing efforts on behalf of the many teachers, fire-fighters, police, service personnel and others in Sarasota County who lack affordable housing.

SURE Carries on Regarding Juvenile Justice

We are active participants in the DART (Direct Action and Research Training Center) Criminal Justice Collaborative. This statewide chart shows the percentage of children who have gotten access to juvenile civil citation, thereby avoiding arrest:

The SURE Criminal Justice research team, led by Rev. Laurie Etter and Rev. Demetrius Jifunza, persists in monitoring the Sarasota County juvenile justice numbers. We continue to meet with Sheriff Hoffman, State Attorney Brodsky, and Clerk of Court Rushing to clarify some on-going issues.

The Community Is Becoming More Aware

Advisory Board, First Presbyterian Church, Sarasota, and SURE network member Steve Fantauzzo, recommended that SURE make a presentation at the July 16 Police Advisory Board meeting. Rev. Laurie Etter, of First Congregational Church, will relate the breadth of SURE participation within the 23 participating churches and give an update regarding juvenile and adult civil citation.

Local Media Coverage

SURE is grateful that *Venice Gondolier* staff writer Morgan Simpson was one of seven media representatives in the statewide Zoom collaborative. Her June 26 article accurately stated what is happening regarding juvenile and adult civil citation issues. Both Sheriff Hoffman and State Attorney Brodsky were quoted as supporting both programs.

The first baby has been born in our Family Promise of Sarasota chapter! Prayers and blessings for baby Moses! Mom, Carline, and baby are doing well.

Carline is a single mom of two other children and was living in her car while working at a local pharmacy. She is working hard to save money for her own apartment, but she will need to be out of work and without income for about 4 weeks. Florida does not offer ANY form of financial support, such as "temporary disability," for new moms. Carline is left without any income while she is out on maternity leave.

Carline is considering returning to work against medical advice because she's concerned about finances. Doing so would not only endanger her health but could expose Moses to health challenges because he is too young to be around other children in daycare.

Any contributions made on her behalf will be used for the costs of shelter and basic needs for Carline and the baby as she looks for a more permanent place to live for herself and her children.
